



HOW LIGHTING AFFECTS CABINETRY

Throughout the day and over the seasons, the lighting conditions in your home will change frequently. You may start the morning with LED under-cabinet lights, then transition to overhead fluorescent or incandescent fixtures. The day may feature bright sunlight or a more diffused overcast, and during meal prep you may have every light in the kitchen on. Perhaps your lighting scheme includes dimmers, or you like to dine by candlelight.

All of these lighting conditions will have an effect on the appearance of your cabinets. In addition, every one of us sees color a bit differently. For all of these reasons, we recommend that you get a door-size sample of the wood species, color and finish enhancement package you are considering. Prop the door up in different areas of the room it will be in, ideally for a day or two in each location. Notice how the color changes under a cool blue LED light, or when seen with a warmer incandescent fixture.

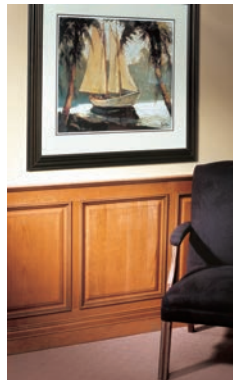
If you have samples of your backsplash material, wall color, countertop and flooring, place the door nearby to see how all of the colors and textures go together. In general, lighter cabinet colors will reflect the surrounding colors more noticeably than darker colors.

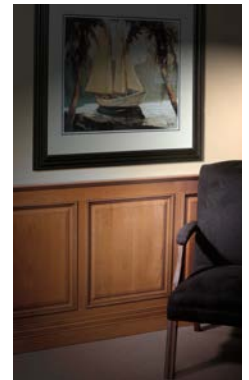
Bright Sunlight
